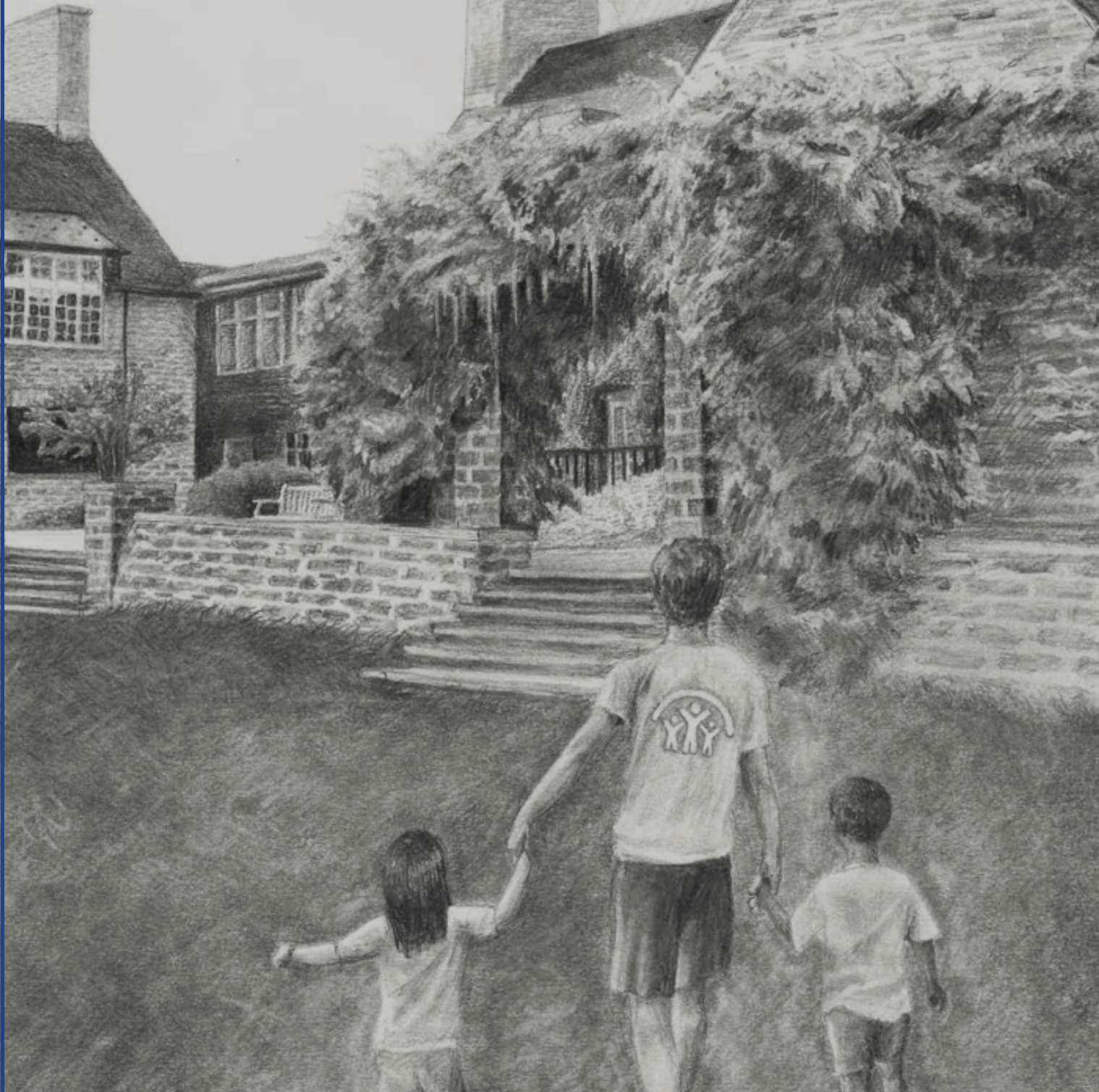

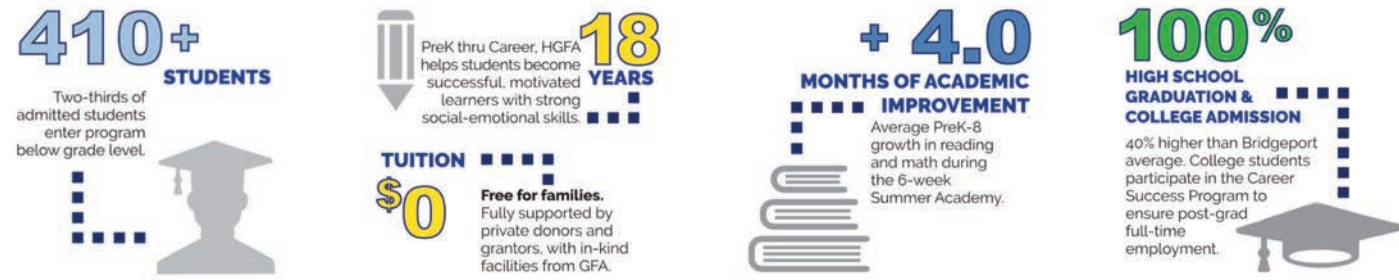

# PROGRAM DATA DASHBOARD



## PREK-8 PROGRAM

Summer 2025 was a busy, joyful, and productive six weeks of learning and experiencing new things for our 213 Bridgeport PreK-8 students. In keeping with our philosophy of work hard, play hard, our students grew their academic skills by an average of 5.5 months in reading and math and had enrichment experiences in cooking, art, chorus, karate, fitness, wrestling, swimming, biking, and shop. We watched in wonder as students explored our new STEM Center—building structures, coding robots, and experimenting with real-world science. Their excitement and curiosity filled the room as they discovered how fun learning can be when imagination and innovation come together. Our commitment to social-emotional learning (SEL) continued with PlayWorks, structured free time group activities that reinforce SEL concepts learned in the classroom. Students enjoyed a wide variety of field trips, and the 8th graders again went on their signature trip to Broadway. The summer finished with our annual Summer Celebration, where 400 family members and friends gathered for food, laughter, a singing performance, and a moving 8th grade graduation and 7th grade moving up ceremony.



# HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM

Students enter the High School Program as 9th graders, moving from the GFA campus to our Bridgeport office. They begin four years of working one-on-one with an academic coach, who prepares and motivates them to achieve in high school in order to have the widest range of post-secondary options possible.

## 2025 HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM SNAPSHOT

- 112 students enrolled
- 56 academic coaches
- 2,860 academic coaching hours
- 100% of 2025 HS seniors graduated
- 68% entered a 4-year college, 32% entered a 2-year to start
- 93% enrolled in a post-secondary program



## COLLEGE & CAREER SUCCESS PROGRAM

The College & Career Success Program provides students with a robust support system after high school graduation. Students receive year-round individual check-ins each month, academic and career coaching, subject-specific tutoring, connections with mentors, access to emergency funds when needed, and numerous events to promote career readiness. We currently have 79 students in the program working with 21 different coaches. Last spring, we celebrated the graduation of 8 of our college students, 7 of whom had been with the program – and each other – since Kindergarten! We anticipate 13 students will graduate from college in spring 2026; see schools our students are attending in the graphic below.

This year we awarded one Kreitler Scholarship of \$20,000 per year over four years to academically motivated high school graduates entering college. Three Kreitler Persistence Scholarships of \$5,000/year were also awarded to currently enrolled Horizons GFA college students.



# MEET THOMAS DONNELLY

Thomas Donnelly entered Horizons GFA as a Kindergartener in 2011. The son of an Ecuatorian mom and American dad, Thomas grew up in the Bridgeport public school system, attending Horizons ever since he was five years old.

His memories run deep: he remembers his teachers, his volunteers, and everyone who ever rode his bus. Around 6th grade, he looked around and thought, "Oh, I get it, this is just summer school. I hate my life," but by 8th grade, his thinking had crystallized into the realization of "Oh, I get it, people are doing this for me, not to me!"

He started volunteering the first moment he could, feeling the need to give back, to "work down the debt." Now a fixture in our summer program classrooms, Thomas organizes and runs the summer event that was of particular importance to him as a kid, Peace Games. His goal is simple: to create for today's kids the kind of memories that shaped his own.

From a young age, Thomas has always been a very talented artist. It comes easily to him. While he enjoys art as a relaxing past-time, he finds academic challenges be far more rewarding. Asked to draw a graphic to print onto Horizons GFA totes, the image he produced was so remarkable to us that we decided it belonged on the cover of this year's annual report.

Last year, Thomas received a scholarship for his final two years at The American University, where he is a history major. His insightful and heartfelt thank you to our founders, Hoby and Sally Kreitler (see opposite page), reveals both the impact donors have on our students, as well as the character of this talented young adult.



# DEAR MR. AND MRS. KREITLER,

I'm writing to express my heartfelt gratitude for your sponsorship of the HGFA College Persistence Scholarship, which I was honored to receive earlier this year. Knowing that this award is supported by the family who helped create Horizons at Greens Farms Academy makes it even more meaningful to me. While we've crossed paths a few times over the years, those interactions were brief, and my hope is that this letter offers a more lasting introduction, one in which I can share what Horizons GFA have meant to me.

From a young age, I heard stories about your early work with Horizons, about the efforts that led to the program's implementation at GFA, the sandwiches made on tables outside GFA, and the first students swimming in your pool. Those stories have always stood out to me as examples of advocacy, perseverance, and hope, the very same values that Horizons has instilled in me as a student. Now, as a Horizons GFA staff member during the summers, and an intern at Horizons Greater Washington during the school year, I work to instill those same values in students who continue to thrive because of yours and other donors' generosity. For years, this generosity was almost mythical to me. I'd hear about it often, and always with reverence, but it felt intangible, something admired from a distance. I now understand that what once felt abstract was simply beyond my comprehension as a younger student.

Through this scholarship, I've come to know your generosity in a more direct and personal way. It's not just the financial support I appreciate, but what it represents: a legacy and continuation of care and commitment to the community that has shaped almost every aspect of my life. To me, this scholarship symbolizes more than persistence in education. It reflects a promise to give my full effort to Horizons for as long as I am able. I've often said in the past that Horizons placed an "irreversible debt" on me because of everything I've received. However, I've come to realize it's not a debt, but an understanding of what it truly means to give back. Your support has only deepened that understanding.

As a young adult, I build on what I learned from my years at Horizons GFA, but I rely on the deeper values that Horizons has taught me. I don't yet know where life will take me after college, but I know Horizons will always be a part of it. It's shaped my choice to major in history, to pursue teaching, and to return each summer to the program that helped build the person I am today.

I'm truly grateful for your continued dedication to a community I'm proud to call home.

# ADVANCING EDUCATIONAL EQUITY FOR BRIDGEPORT PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS

## WHO ARE WE?

- Horizons GFA is an innovative academic enrichment program that was established in 2000, the first Horizons program to address the rapidly growing achievement gap in Bridgeport.
- While Horizons operates under the non-profit status of GFA, we are wholly independent and self-funded, raising 100% of our budget from events, individual giving, foundations, and community organizations. GFA generously provides administrative support, valuable guidance, and facilities critical to the operation of the program, but provides no direct financial support.
- Our students are admitted from under-performing Bridgeport public schools. Families must meet income limits. We do not admit students from parochial or private schools as our charter requires that we support Bridgeport students with the greatest need of educational opportunity. Two-thirds of our students are below grade level when they enter the program.
- Horizons GFA started as a K-8 program but rapidly expanded as our students encountered the challenges of high school and post-secondary education. We have grown from 24 students in 2000 to now serving 408 students in grades PreK through college. We are currently the only Horizons affiliate (there are 72) that serves students from PreK all the way through college and career.
- With three integrated programs, we commit to supporting our students tuition-free for 16+ years as they progress through their educational journey. Our program components were designed to serve students at each stage of development, and include the PreK-8 Program, the High School Program, and the College and Career Success Program.
- Horizons GFA has been providing tiered, age-appropriate social-emotional learning (SEL) skills training for over 10 years. Our curriculum is infused with SEL concepts to reinforce empathy, self-awareness, resilience, and positive relationship-building in every aspect and at every level of the learning experience.

## OUR RESULTS!



### 4-6 MONTHS Academic Growth

Over just six weeks every summer, our PreK-8 students make incredible gains in reading and math, with below-grade level students making even greater gains. Our programming eliminates summer learning loss, the primary cause of the achievement gap.



### 100% High School Graduation

For over a decade, 100% of our high school students have graduated on time. By contrast, 42% of Bridgeport public school students are at risk of not graduating from high school due to chronic absenteeism, too few credits, or dropping out.



### 100% Admission to College

All students are admitted to a post-secondary program, either a two or four year, depending on the career goals, and 92% graduate within six years, with 100% employed within one year of graduation.

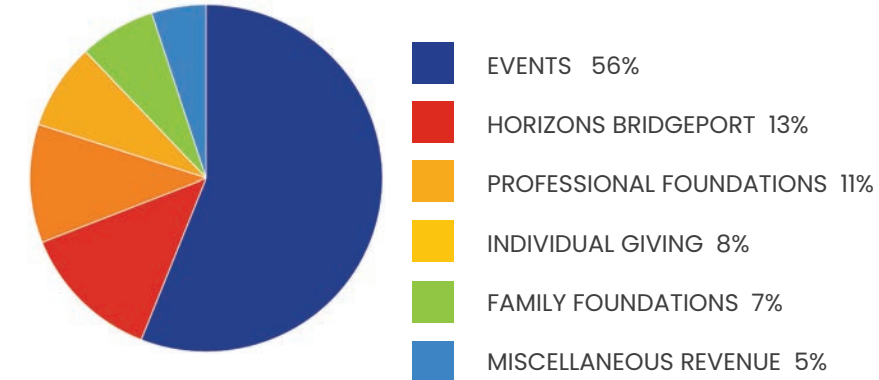
# FINANCIALS

The operations of Horizons GFA are entirely self-funded, with 100% of revenue coming from charitable giving by individuals, foundations, community organizations and corporations. In addition, we receive, and greatly benefit from, the educational expertise and in-kind administrative services generously provided by Greens Farms Academy.

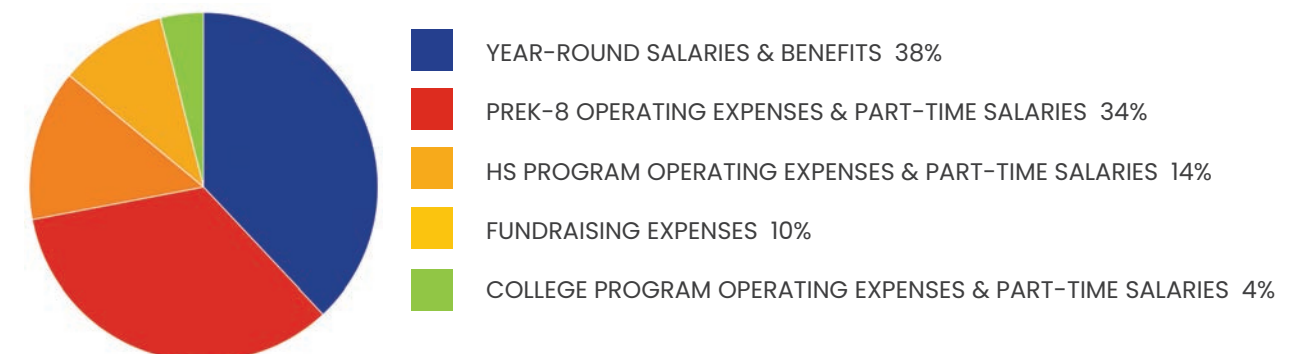
We continually strive to diversify our fundraising portfolio to ensure a stable funding base. We pursue new funding sources from foundations, community organizations, and individuals to ensure multi-year sustainability.

We are in the early stages of multi-year and pledged giving initiatives in addition to exploring expanded corporate support. Our goal is to maintain consistent, predictable revenue that can accommodate budgetary growth without sacrificing program integrity.
